#RegrowPuertoRico was a humble campaign started by four Center for Agroecology and Sustainable Food Systems (CASFS) apprentices. We are all connected to Puerto Rico and were devastated by the hurricanes' destruction last September. We set out to raise donations and the response from the Santa Cruz community and donors all over the world has been incredible. ¡Gracias, gracias, gracias!

We are writing this to share our final donation numbers and how they were distributed. **We surpassed our desired goal and raised a total of \$21,158!** Donations went directly to organizations supporting small farmers, the farmers themselves, and to ship donated materials (except for the 3% Generosity.com withheld.) Supporting Grassroots Agriculture Activism







<u>Fondo de Resiliencia</u> is a grassroots effort powering local regional-food systems, sustainable farming practices, farmers markets, food communities, and the decolonization of agriculture. They are supporting 200 farms with rain water collection, seed donations, reforestation, planting, and more. We raised \$5,000 + <u>The Cheesecake Factory Inc.</u> donated \$5,500!

Supporting Student-Driven Community Food Garden







<u>Huerto Semilla UPRRP</u> is an educational, urban agroecological community garden. It was founded and is sustained by students at the University of Puerto Rico Río Piedras Campus. They are using the funds for tools and outreach for the garden.

Supporting Local Organic Seeds







<u>Desde Mi Huerto</u> is the largest organic seed bank in Puerto Rico. The owner, Raul, is pictured on the right telling us about the most requested seeds on the island and his plans for installing solar energy. On the left, seeds are being separated into seed packets. We raised \$5,500 and <u>Santa Cruz Heirloom Seeds</u> donated \$2,000 raised!

Nadja Zoe Vale from <u>Proyecto Uvas de Puerto Rico</u> explains her rooftop table grape model. The project is 8 years old and the model was developed by Nadja and her father, Jorge Vale. They lost all of their \$500 models yet saved plant materials to restart the project. We were able to gift her \$500 + \$500 from <u>Escribanas</u> to support 2 models!

Overall, we helped raised \$21,158 from over 200 donors to regrow Puerto Rico!
